*What He Must Be...if he wants to marry my daughter* by Dr. Voddie Baucham Jr.

The rather humorous title of this book belies the very serious nature of the subject, while at the same time providing a succinct summation of the content within. It follows that one of the most important things a father can do for his daughter is to help her find the best match to be her life-long partner—one who will be a priest, prophet, provider and protector.
