

Christmas.
Based on my experience with that one, I decided to make

some changes. First, we found that the neckline was too high, especially when worn with any kind of collared shirt. I remedied that by making my apron with a wide scooped neckline. I also made a minor adjustment to the back which made it fit a little better. I didn't bother to use the pattern piece for the

back ties, I just eye-balled the length and width. The fabric I used is from a neighbor who passed away last year.

In the lower right corner, you can see the dress we made for my cousin Ivy's birthday (it's the purple one). Moriah, Bethany and I collaborated on the design, and Bethany did most of the construction. I used the Girls Regency dress pattern and

added the "sleeves" from the Pinafore and Pantaloons pattern.

The pockets were eyeballed.
